SHARE Program Opening Keynote

By Frank Abagnale of the FBI and "Catch Me If You Can" bio-movie

- Taught at FBI Academy for 40 years
- · Restitution (most lost cash will never be returned or recovered)
- Every 2 seconds someone's identity is stolen
 - In 2018, 3.6 billion identity records stolen
 - · Carnage of compromised credentials, especially during pandemic
 - Every single breach is a failure of someone, or people

- · People steal credentials and wait 3.5 years before using them
 - >>I or 2 year credit monitoring is worthless
- Child identities are 10% of all stolen IDs
 - 12 year old identity is worth twice that of a 64 year old
 - New born identity is worth even more
- Cryptocurrency means there will also be ransomware
- · Phishing e-mails have gotten much better

SHARE Program Opening Keynote continued

Soft spots

- Out-of-office messages, etc.
- Vulnerable access points in smart buildings
- Home hazards: internet-of-things, smart televisions, smartphones and tablets, Mac and windows computers
- How would someone misuse this technology?

SHARE Program Opening Keynote continued

Building security into our technology

- Passwords are for tree houses
- 18 billion password attacks a year
- \$100 million a year to reset passwords in 3 largest banks in US
- · Identification by device and personal id are heading toward eliminating passwords

Stay off social media

- Date of birth and where you were born are 2 of three items needed to steal your identity
- 70% of employers vet based on social media
- 54% of employers have rejected candidates after finding objectionable material

SHARE Program Opening Keynote continued

Shred everything

- ribbon shredder (30 minutes to recreate)
- criss-cross shredder (recreated in a few hours)
- micro-cut shredder cannot be recreated

Freeze your credit

- · Credit monitoring take responsibility to protect yourself
- · Daily credit scoring, review reports for errors, see all queries plus other
- · Checks do not use from most accounts (too much personal info, easy to steal)
- · Credit card is safest, not debit/credit card

- Pandemic fraud
 - \$860 billion given to states for unemployment
 - \$160 billion was fraudulently obtained
- · Medicare fraud is \$100 billion a year
- Cartels have better technology than governments
- \$37 billion stolen by scammers targeting elderly adults, 10,000 a day

- · Scam Me if You Can book by Abagnale
 - royalties to AARP
- Millennials are scammed more, Seniors lose more money
- · Red flags money now, ask for personal information
- · Caller identification easily manipulated

- · No technology can defeat social engineering, only people can
- Education is critical
 - Yet No public service ads or information stuffers any more to educate about scams and rip-offs

Installing z/OS v2r5 using z/OSMF Software Management

By 4 presenters from Banco de Brasilia (BRB)

- Moved from Unisys to IBM Z in the past 8 years (completed in 2018)
- Bank established 2020 marketing partnership with Flamingo soccer team
 - Tremendous growth from 1 million customers to now 4.4 million customers
 - MSUs consumed per month doubled from Feb21-Jul22
- Software and Hardware Environment
 - 2 sites with same equipment one for PROD and one for DEV/TEST+DR

Installing z/OS v2r5 using z/OSMF continued

z/OS 2.5 Release Beta Program

- March 2021 initial 2.5 materials available
- April client education by IBM
- May Shopz order
- June beta Serverpac arrived
 - June 8 start order, June 15 1st IPL, June 16 IPL on support with automation

Installing z/OS v2r5 using z/OSMF continued

z/OS 2.5 Release Beta Program continued

- July complete installation
 - July 13 1st IPL on development
- Sept. official z/OS 2.5 GA
- Dec. 2021 exit beta review

Installing z/OS v2r5 using z/OSMF continued

z/OS 2.5 Release Beta Program continued

- Lessons Learned
 - Reduces error
 - Reduces complexity
 - Early tenure system programmers can do this
 - Facility to edit JCL and configure all steps

Data Set File System Use Cases

Understanding the Support behind SHARE's #1 Requirement

by Kershaw Mehta of IBM

- July 2021 SOD about file system support to access z/OS data sets
- June 2022 part of z/OS 2.5 2Q 2022 enhancements announcement
- Data Set File System is only on z/OS 2.5
- Use z/OS data sets from z/OS Unix
- Several APARs (see Kershaw's handout)

Data Set File System Use Cases - continued

- Data set serialization like ISPF
- SAF-based security applies
- /dsfs is a new Mountpoint provided by IBM
 - /dsfs/txt code page IBM-1047
 - Text file does not contain a <NEWLINE> character
 - /dsfs/bin (binary) RECFM FB or U
 - /dsfs/rec (variable length binary)

Data Set File System Use Cases - continued

- Kershaw.jcl.cntl mapped to /dsfs/txt/Kershaw/jcl.cntl
- Kershaw.proj.source(myfile) maps to /dsfs/txt/Kershaw/proj.source/myfile
- Dsadm is new Unix command
 - Dsadm createparm to specify MVS data set attributes RECFM and LRECL and such
 - Attributes similar to BPXWDYN keywords
- Grep works within a PDS
- Cmp (compare) two members

The Magic of PSWs and Registers

By Patty Little, Elliott Picker, John Shebey of IBM

- A great Look at the underpinnings of z/OS Architecture
- Very helpful for Debugging
- PSW (Program Status Word) and (in 2000) z/Architecture PSW (zPSW)
 - scrunching I28>64 and unscrunching 64>I28

z/OS 2.5 User Experience

By Ed Jaffe of Phoenix Software International

- Ed J. plays when system is up so this session focuses on that work, not on install
- IBM delivers an average 6.5 SPEs a week across the z/OS world
- Early delivery of z/OS 2.5 delayed 4.5 weeks by LOG4J issues

z/OS 2.5 User Experience - continued

- z/OSMF File, Folder and Job manipulation
 - JOB Output list needs work
 - Liked the red for failed jobs
 - Browse looks good, right-click for command palette
 - Data Set File Search looks good but a couple of concerns
 - Edit very good, links to other files
 - Compare is excellent
 - Data set list has no additional info (tracks, volume, attributes) not good

z/OS 2.5 User Experience - continued

- z/OSMF CFRM Policy Editor
 - Export results can be put in PARMLIB for future restarts
- Updated RACF PassTicket Capabilities
 - Enhanced Pass Tickets including option to change timeout/expiration interval
- Enhanced System Recovery Boost (ESRB)
 - Not a technical restriction, limited function to z16 just to sell more z16s

z/OS 2.5 User Experience - continued

• Data Privacy for Diagnostics

- Use sample job in SYS1.SAMPLIB(BLSDPJIN)
- Redact, Analyze, Report
- analysis_config.json for analyzer
- Use Report output to review analysis report and flag what was not correct
 - Not sure Sysprogs should look at sensitive stuff
 - 94% false
 - FEEDBACK function updates analyze file so future dumps have less false positives
 - Recommends one (long) pass at least to reduce false positives
- Ingest of additional sensitive data identifications
 - See APAR OA58114 for additional doc

z/OS 2.5 User Experience - continued

- z/OS Data Set file System
- pwd (print working directory)!
- DSFS needs better way of managing contention instead of timer checks
- Migrated data sets are not processed by DSFS big problem for Phoenix Software International (PSI)

So I Bought a z I 14!

By Enzo D'Amato Enzo@enterpriselab.dev

- 16 year old high school student with Asperger's syndrome
- Built first computer in 4th grade
- April 2021 saw State of NY selling z114 for \$500
 - Parents did not want to build a power substation
 - LICCC codes for the CPCs were destroyed so hardware was useless
- Found a unit on eBay and bought it with parents' permission

So I Bought a z I 14! - continued

- Physical Planning followed the Installation Manual for Physical Planning
 - 3-phase 220V
 - Avoid multi-frame models as 3-phase power required
 - Wired 2 phase together to provide power to single frame
 - Seller had no forklift to get on pallet
 - LiftStar had to find someone with lift gate and truck
- Paid for shipping and machine and worked on getting peripherals

So I Bought a z I 14! - continued

- OSA/ICC and printers run over TCP/IP
- DASD is nightmare
 - FBA with Linux driver
 - CKD storage is almost impossible to find
- Machine too big for truck doors, took computer covers off and got it on truck
- 1800 lb. Mainframe slightly too tall for garage door, broke door frame to get machine into garage
- 2012 z114 model arrived in mid-2022

So I Bought a z I 14! - continued

- Initial setup
 - Missing hardware was eventually shipped to him
 - Fiber Channel took I/O Centos software updates to make work
- TS7720 machine never setup
- IOCDS "read the manual"
 - Help from Gary Eheman at FlexCUB
 - Got working

So I Bought a z I 14! - continued

- Linux and z/VM installation and configuration
 - I GB and I0GB network cards are not connected
 - Program ACL on storage box and software broken
 - Finally linux works
 - z/VM install ran fine
 - IPL from SCSI requires very specific HCD parameters
- Dirmaint

So I Bought a z I 14! - continued

- VSEn installation went fine (thanks to 21st Century Software)
- A week until slides were due to SHARE about z/OS
- "Mainframe from Scratch" Redbook is awesome
- IBM is sending z/OS ServerPac (for free!)
- Message on Linked-In and ask nicely is secret to get software

What's New in z/OS 2.5: The BuckEye Edition

By Gary Puchkoff of IBM

- z/OS V2R5 became generally available in late September 2021
 - After July 10, 2022, all SRELs must be installed using z/OSMF Software Management
 - IBM V2.5 System Functions will support IBM Semeru Java DK VII (64-bit only) by V2.5 end of life (2026)
 - Available for z/OS in Nov. 2021
- z/OS Container Extensions (zCX Linux Docker containers running on z/OS)
 - IBM Z and LinuxONE Container Registry enhances customer trust in this technology https://ibm.biz/BdfAdW
 - IBM zCX Foundation for Red Hat OpenShift New Product IQ2022
- Modernization, simplification, automation e.g., via Ansible z/OSMF integration
- SOD June 2020 Native z/OS containers, cloud storage for z/OS data

What's New in z/OS 2.5: The BuckEye Edition

- Cyber resiliency, pervasive encryption, anomaly mitigation e.g., using Predictive Failure Analysis, System Recovery Boost, Run-Time Diagnostics, etc.
- z/OS Data Set File System is Available; previously a Statement Of Direction
- PDSE member compression automatic, transparent to user
- Security enhancements lots of them!
 - RACF Health Checks
 - Data Privacy for Diagnostics (dump data for IBM and vendors)
